2019 was a year that no one will forget, we had many mishaps within our little community; some of which were the roof collapse of the Civic Centre, and the early closure of the Arena & Municipal Pool. Despite that the community came together and we had some amazing support within. Between moving the Theatre to the Collins Hall and juggling all the rentals, the Recreation & Culture Department pulled it off! Below you will find the year ends stats.

## Welcome Centre / Civic Centre

4628 people visited the Welcome Centre sites, at the Civic Centre, and then at Collins Hall, as well as the summer trailer at Westview Trailer Park

## Theatre

### Civic Centre Theatre

The Civic Centre hosted 4 shows and 3 rehearsals with a total of 868 in attendance.

### Collins Hall Theatre

The Theatre was moved to Collins Hall, which hosted 28 shows with a total of 6,433 audience members.

There was a total of **13** rehearsal dates for the above shows, with a total of **330** performers and a total of 18 hours of ELATE rehearsals.

## Fire Tower Lookout and Ranger Heritage Centre

The Ranger Heritage Centre, located at the Fire Tower Lookout, stepped up to the plate to host some of our museum traffic. Visitors came from Arizona, Florida, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, Wisconsin, from Alberta, British Columbia, Manitoba, Nova Scotia, Quebec, Saskatchewan, all across Ontario and from Australia.

The Fire Tower Lookout recorded **6145** vehicles visiting the site.

## Trailhead Information Centre

The traffic counter at the Trailhead recorded **6,849 vehicles**. **75%** headed to Elliot Lake.

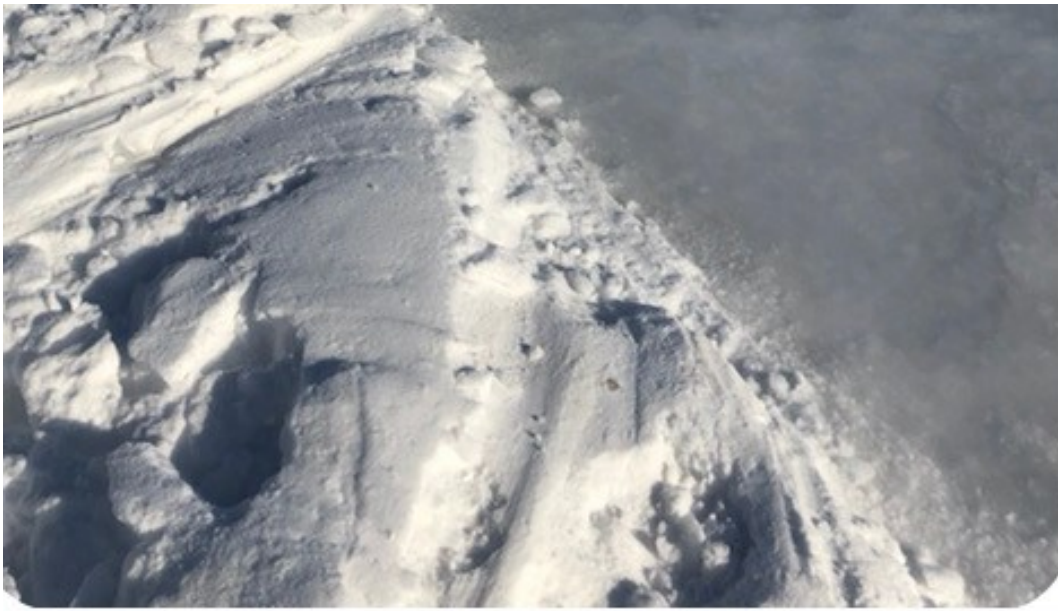
